TECHNICAL NEWS

R1b with DYS393=23, DYS492=13?

You might want to test for S21 with www.ethnancestry.com (will require a new swab if you haven't tested with them before). NOTE: if you are in a group of closely matching haplotypes, and you are the ONLY DYS492=13, you are probably not going to be S21+.

S21+ R1b seems to have a central/Eastern European origin and be about 10,000 years old. Research is ongoing on this sub-clade, so if you are interested in deeper origins, you might wish to test and then join the R1b project.

The pension file shows this: On March 10, 1847 "Tempa Collins" (as signed by mark: "Mrs Tempy Collins" in the text, and clearly meaning Temperance Vinson Collins, also often spelled Tempey, as I usually have spelled it in my text) filed an affidavit at the Court of Pleas and Quarter Session for Franklin County, noting that James Collins had died on December 23, 1838 (two days before Christmas!) in his 84th year, and that she was his widow, having been married to him by one John **Webb** in Franklin County on March 16, 1784. (The Webbs, remember, were another possible Kingsale family.)

NOTE: This last comment refers to the Kingsale Swamp area of Isle of Wight County, VA. Franklin Co, NC formed in 1779 from Bute, which was formed in 1764 from Granville
