TIMETABLES FOR LAB PROCESSING

FTDNA has issued the following TYPICAL times for processing. You may use these as guidelines when submitting a kit or ordering an upgrade.

12 Marker Y-DNA	- 4 weeks
25 Marker Y-DNA	- 6 weeks
37 Marker Y-DNA	- 6 weeks
12 to 25 Marker Y-DNA Upgrade	- 4 Weeks
12 to 37 Marker Y-DNA Upgrade	- 4 Weeks
25 to 37 Marker Y-DNA Upgrade	- 2 Weeks
mtDNA Tests	- 5 Weeks

(kits go to the lab in batches every 2 weeks)

These times are for tests that have a successful outcome from the first run at the lab. Approximately 85% of the first runs are successful. The tests are rerun on the other 15% until a good result is obtained.

Unfortunately, **each rerun adds two weeks to the process.**

TOPIC OF INTEREST R1b -- breakthrough in geographic origins?

I have previously discussed on this list some work that researchers have done in isolating certain "I" sub-haplogroups and sets of haplotypes as probably having particular geographic origins. This work is continuing and a major report will soon be forthcoming identifying these sub-groups clearly.

Unfortunately most of our WEBBs are R1b --that HUGE haplogroup which accounts for about 30% of all European and European heritage males. It has stubbornly been resistant to being broken down into sub groups which indicate a geographic origin -- until very recently. Within the last month, researchers believe they have discovered two sub-groups which suggest particular geographic origins.

The first of these is what they currently refer to as the "Irish" R1b. Using a variety of databases, from YHRD to Family Tree's Recent Ethnic Origins data, they believe the following combination of marker data points toward Irish/Western Isles origins:

DYS390=25 DYS391=11 and DYS392=14. These also appear to have YCA IIa/b=19, 23

For the WEBBs there is one group meeting these criteria: the Joseph WebbGroup 26948, 20951 & 22768. This does not necessarily mean that the immigrant ancestor boarded a boat in Ireland for the Colonies. It means there is a strong **suspicion** that sometime within the last few thousand years, AFTER the Last Glacial Maximum (LGM), the ancestor of all R1bs with the above marker values lived in Ireland.

This is still in the stage of developing theory. However, it couldn't hurt to recruit some Irish WEBBs into the Project!

Richard Webb of Twickenham (fl. 1660)

The third main block of Crown lands in Twickenham was said in 1669 to be called the Queen's farm. (Footnote 42) From the mid-16th century the leases included a house in Twickenham, which seems to have stood in the Mount Lebanon-Orleans House area, and 53 acres, of which about 20 lay behind and around the house, 10 lay just across the parish boundary in Teddington, and the rest were in Twickenham and Whitton fields. (Footnote 43) Like the other Crown property it was leased to royal officials and others. (Footnote 44) By 1592 the tenant in possession was one (perhaps Christopher) Rythe of Twickenham. (Footnote 45) In a map of 1607, however, a fairly large house in this area was marked, like York House, as belonging to Sir James Pemberton, and in 1635 Glover attributed it to Lady Falkland. (Footnote 46) In 1669 it was said that Theophilus Rythe had held the farm, with other lands of his own, and that his son Solomon had sold it to Andrew Pitcairne. (Footnote 47) The date of this sale is unknown, but in 1638 Pitcairne, who already held York House, secured a reversion (for 1652-67) of the then current lease of this farm. In 1650 his widow Charity held the lease. (Footnote 48) The house was evidently a fine one with well-stocked gardens, (Footnote 49) but Richard Webb, who bought it from Charity Pitcairne or her son before 1660, seems to have built another house close by. (Footnote 50) It seems possible that the original farm-house stood on the site of Mount Lebanon or Riverside, while Webb's was almost certainly on the site of Orleans House. Parliament had sold the property in 1651 to Captain Richard Ell, (Footnote 51) who after the Restoration continued to hold land on its western boundary, (Footnote 52) and a conveyance of 1697 expressly excluded both a house formerly built on part of the property by Richard Ell and a house formerly in possession of Solomon Rythe and later of Richard Ell: (Footnote 53) one of these was possibly on the site of Mount Lebanon and the other of Riverside House. (Footnote 54) Richard Webb, meanwhile, sold his interests in the whole property, presumably including both his new house and the older one, in 1661.
