TECHNICAL NOTES

1. WAMH Match sign on your personal page. R1b Haplogroup only!

On the upper left of some personal pages, there is a small white square with blue lettering WAMH MATCH. WAMH stands for Western Atlantic Modal Haplotype, which means that most of the markers among this group conform to the modal values found all along the Western Atlantic coastline from the tip of Spain up through the UK. Most if not all of the Giles Webb Group will fall into this category (I did NOT look at each individual page to verify this, but enough of them have it that I suspect all do). Some of the other WEBB R1b groups may also have designation.

One thing to note is that this means you will have matches with other surnames at MORE MARKERS more than anyone who does NOT fall into this group. As an example I have "picked on" kits 14391 who has tested at 37 markers, and kit 16708 who has tested almost all the markers on the market ☺. Both kits are in what is currently called the "Giles Webb Group."

Note that some of this dramatic drop off is attributable to the fact that far more people have tested 12 markers than 25+, more have tested 25 than 37+, and more have tested 37 than 67+.

Also note that 16708 has NO WEBB matches at 67 markers, despite the fact that SOME people in the GILES WEBB GROUP have tested 67 markers, although MOST have NOT. This leads me to believe that two things will assist us in further separation of persons in the WAMH group.

1. Upgrading to 67 markers where significant differences may be found that will help in delineating subdivisions of this group.

2. SNP testing, both through FTDNA and/or Ethnoancestry (EA).

16708 has had SNP testing at EA and was found to be

Bio of Robert Dickens Webb

From *The Physicians and Surgeons of the United States* by William Biddle Atkinson (1878)

Webb, Robert Dickens, Livingston, Ala, son of Capt. S S Webb and Ann Moore Dickens Webb, was born in North Carolina, Nov. 14th, 1824. His education, both general and medical, was obtained in the univ. of Va, whence he graduated in 1850. He settled first in St. Louis, but removed to Livingston in 1853, on account of climatic influences producing bronchial troubles. He is a member of the Sumter co. med. soc., and of the Ala State med. asso.; has been secretary of the former since 1866, was vice-president of the latter in 1874, and one of its board of censors in 1876. His contributions to medical literature are reports on "Syme's Perineal Section for Stricture and Scrotal Fistula," and a "Case of Diabetes Mellitus," St. Louis Medical and Surgical Journal, 1852; report on "The Diseases of Sumter County" to the State asso. in 1871, and report of "Hemorrhagic Malarial Fever," Transactions of State med. assoc. 1876. In April, 1853, he married Julia Fulton.

We find Robert D. 55 [1825], Doctor, born in NC with parents born in NC and Julia F Webb 45 born in Alabama with father born in TN and Mother born in AL, in the 1880 Census with an adopted son Cockrell Penschaw(?) age 7 in Livingston Part of Beat 1 Sumter CO, AL (06/07/1880). In 1870, they are in Township 19 Range 1,2,3 & 4 (08/01/01870) Livingston PO, Robert D physician 45 NC, Julia F 35 AL and Elizabeth 15 AL

The couple isn't readily found in 1860. However in 1850 Sumter Co, AL we find Samuel S. Webb 59 Inn keeper NC, Ann M Webb 53 NC, Samuel S. Webb Jr 15 M AL and Mary S Webb 12 F AL and Mary Ann Griswell 35 CT.

Going back to 1860, we find R. D. Webb 35 MD NC, J F Webb 25 E D Webb F 5 AL. S S and A M Webb are both still in Sumter Co, AL, well into their 60s. Note that S S Webb is far too young to have been a Capt. In the Revolution, and too old to have been a Captain in the Civil War. Possibly he was captain in the War of 1812, although he was still somewhat young then for that.

In 1840, Saml S Webb is in Sumter Co, AL with 2 M<5, 1 5/10, 1 10/15 3 15/20 1 20/30 and 1 M 40/50 [get female figures]

In 1830, there is a Samuel Webb with 3 M <5 2 5/10 1 15/20 1 20/30 and 1 30/40 1 F <5, 1 F 10/15, and 1 F 30/40.

English Immigrant Voices, Labourers' Letters from Upper Canada in the 1830s: The Petworth Emigration Set by Wendy Cameron, Sheila Haines, Mary McDougall Maude

This is a book with several letters of people who lived in Petworth, Canada, with maps and letters.

Map on page xlvii shows a Webb in Grantham quite near the US border. This is Joseph Webb, whose letter is on pages 178/9. Joseph's wife is Ann(e) Richards and wrote a letter to his father, William Webb in Felpham, West Sussex. Joseph and his wife married in South Bersted, 1821 and had 5 children by the time they emigrated to Canada (Sarah, Joseph(c. 1825 -), Ann, William, and James). Joseph gives his address as St. Catherine's Upper Canada, North America. The book notes that Joseph and Ann cannot be identified in records after this 1835 with certainty.

Another Webb mentioned is Mary Ann Webb who married Charles Hilton 22 Oct 1815 Broadwater. This couple also emigrated to Canada .
