### IMPORTANT EVENTS IN GENETIC GENEALOGY

#### 1. Family Tree DNA and DNA-FP merged effective August 1, 2006.

If you have tested with either company, you will be able to order markers from their combined offerings through Family Tree DNA. The software won't be set up to do this just yet (give them about a month). That means if you ordered from DNA Heritage originally, then got tests through DNA-FP, you will now be able to order FTDNA's panel of markers 38-67, or any additional previously exclusively DNA-FP markers. If you are a Family Tree customer, you will be able to add DNA-FP markers and tests (I highly recommend 464X for all R1b WEBBs!). If you tested originally through DNA-FP, you can add the FTDNA panel 38-67. The DNA-FP tests and markers will be available at the prices stated on their website ([www.dna-fingerprint.com](http://www.dna-fingerprint.com)) through the Conference in November.

#### 2. Haplogroup Projects available through FTDNA

You can join a haplogroup project – the R1b Project has over 600 members now. These projects are involved in research regarding the migration patterns of the haplogroup and the origins of sub-clades. Even if you are not primarily interested in this anthropological sort of information, I would encourage you to join your haplogroup project, particularly if you have 37+ markers

measured. The research goal is to "close the gap" between what Y-DNA matches within genealogical time and haplogroup sub-clade information tells us about 1000s of years ago. For instance, I know that my father's R1b haplotype has a documented genealogy back to a fellow born c. 1750 who married in Blekinge, Sweden (Southern tip near Denmark). This unfortunate fellow had the name Nils Larsson, and I do not know whether he was a "local boy" or came from another part of Sweden, Denmark, etc. When I input the short 11 marker haplotype allowed by YHRD ([www.yhrd.org](http://www.yhrd.org)), I get only two matches, in Verona, Italy. However, my DYS438=13, which is not a common value; I feel it might be a "recent" mutation in my line – i.e. within the last 600 years or so. When I change the YHRD search to DYS438=12 (the more common value on this marker), I get 42 exact matches worldwide. 12 are in Portugal (1.03% of the 3 populations studied), 9 are in Spain (1.17% of the 4 Spanish populations listed). One more is again, in Verona, 1 in Switzerland, 1 in Stuttgart, Germany, and 1 in Central Bohemia, Czechia – about 0.4% of these populations. Three, however, are in Denmark – 1.2% of this population. Two are in London (0.7%), and 2 are in Ireland (1.3%). A recent paper using 9 marker haplotypes in Sweden found 2 8/9 matches in Blekinge, 2 exact matches in Skaraborg and one 8/9 match in Skaraborg, one exact match in Värmland, and one exact match in Östergötland/Jönköping. I have no exact matches in the Scandinavian Project (yet); nothing even within the level of a 37 marker match. I have yet to look at the R1b Project (<http://www.familytreedna.com/public/r1b>), or Y-search, Y-Base, or Y-match. However, I am beginning to see that my haplotype probably arose in the immediate geographic area in which my ancestors lived in 1750. Ultimately, I may be able to say, "my male ancestor arrived in S. Sweden c. 1000 AD, from \_\_place\_\_." My next step will be to get him SNP tested and then expand his marker values.

The G Haplogroup Project has SPECIFICALLY asked that all G surname participants join their haplogroup project.

Sir: By order of Gen. Baker I am directed to rendezvous on the Little Brazos at the house of **Jesse Webb**, 20 miles above Nashville. You will repair to that post with all possible diligence. It is unnecessary to urge dispatch to a soldier.

You will pass through a country infested with small bands of Indians, and it will be necessary to use every precaution to prevent them from stealing horses.

By order of Geo. W. Bonnell, Major Commanding.

Headquarters, Nacogdoches, Dec. 2d, 1838. *Capt. Joseph Daniels.*

### Johanna Webb

In 1642, a Mr. Cobbs arrived in Northampton County, Virginia from England. A letter from William Webb of London refers to "Mr. Cobbs intending towards your parts with Sir Edmund Plowden.. Please assist towards furnishing him in stocking his plantation.." He is likely the John Cobb who appears in later records between 1650 to 1688.

John appears as a neighbor to John Major in 1650 and in 1661 secures a grant for 600 acres because of his role in the "transportation of 12 persons".
