"1000 Years of WEBBs?"

When the results for 12634 came in, he had a number of Gen Distance one matches with WEBBs at the 12 marker level, but none at the 25 or 37 marker level. They were as follow:

Then I looked at 30261's matches (Giles Webb Group), WHOA! he had GD = 1 matches with folks in OTHER groups

As you may have guessed, as I continued to work my way through the matches, more and more GROUPS got pulled into the analysis. I ended up with a group of 49 WEBBs which looked to be from a common ancestor -- I say 1000 years because that is about the time surnames began to be adopted.

At present, I am working on pairwise comparisons for each pair of people. As you probably know, FTDNA will not report 21/25 matches as matches. Nor 32/37 matches.

I also urge DWX712 to test for the 5 markers FTDNA offers that DNAH does not by ordering them in the upcoming DNA-Fingerprint Batch. If the batch makes the 50% discount level, this would be a total cost of \$49.01 for Isolation+kit+DYS607+DYS576+DYS570+CDYa/b (DYS724).

I anticipate this may revise a number of groupings.

FTDNA has upgraded their database to allow you to enroll your results in more than one Project. Other than your surname Project, there are Haplogroup and Mitogroup Projects now & geographical/ethnic heritage projects.

FTDNA Participant pages: Forgotten how to sign on? First make sure that your current email address is entered in the FTDNA record. You can do this by emailing me and asking me to check it. If it's not, I can make the change in the email address for you. Once we have verified this to be the case, you can go to the login page and request your User Name and Password for your FTDNA personal page.

DNA-FP Participant pages: Some of you who ordered in early batches may not know that DNA-Fingerprint (formerly Biotix) has now made personal pages available. If you do not know how to access your personal page, you need your kit #. This you can get from me if you do not know it. Then follow these directions for accessing your personal page.

DNA-Fingerprint has made personal pages available for their customers, and your results will be posted there. Be sure to use your own kit #!

1.) Go to

2.) In the "User name" field type in your laboratory number:

3.) Leave the "E-mail address" and the "Confirmation code" fields blank

and push the "Send password" button.

4.) The system will send out an e-mail to you with a confirmation code.

5.) Go back to

6.) Now fill out all fields (laboratory number, your e-mail address and

the confirmation code).

7.) Push the "Send password" button again.

8.) You will receive an e-mail with a password, which you can use to log in your account.

9.) Now you can login in your account (laboratory number & the mailed password) and look at your results.

10.) Make sure, that you change your password at "My account" "Edit your information"
